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I know gmediafinder, I think it's already in my repo (at least for EL6).

The problem with all these applications is that youtube will change its algorithm for serving videos regularly and they must keep up with it. Gmediafinder has not been updated (on github) for 4 years, not sure it even works any more.

As far as alternatives go, have a look at <http://isebaro.com/viewtube/> - it's a greasemonkey script that replaces the official video stream with the native video player.
